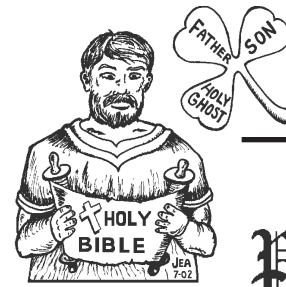

St. Patrick lived in England and Ireland about 372-492 A.D. He died on March 17th. On this day we celebrate *Saint Patrick's Day!* How did he become a **saint**? What are saints supposed to do in life? Did he really drive the snakes out of Ireland? His interesting story is found in three ancient manuscripts that are kept at Trinity College, Dublin, Ireland.

His real name was Patricius Magonus Sucus and he lived in a small village along the western seacoast of Great Britain. His parents were Roman immigrants to Britain and they were rich and well educated. His family was large with five sisters and one brother.

Most important of all, Patrick's parents were true Christians who believed in the living God and had received His Son Jesus Christ as their personal Savior (*read St. John 1:12-13!*)

The Pastor of the village was very concerned about Patrick, and often spoke to him of his need to trust in Christ. Jesus had died on the cross for Patrick's sins and rose again from the grave with complete forgiveness for every sin he had committed. 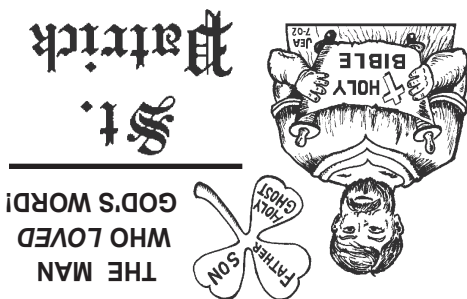
